Fire Warden Report Fire Permits Required by Law. Yes, this includes Fire Pits!

The State of New Hampshire requires all persons to obtain a "permit to kindle a fire" prior to <u>any</u> outside burning including brush fires, cooking fires and seasonal camp fires. A permit to kindle a fire is also required for chimineas and other portable pottery or metal fireplaces. You must be at least 18 years of age to obtain a fire permit and you must be the property owner or have written permission from the property owner to kindle a fire. Temple's Forest Fire Warden, Mike Connolly (603-209-0699) can issue you a burn permit and will advise you of the rules and laws and fire class day conditions. All fires must be at least 25 feet from any structure. Make sure fires are attended at all times & completely out when done. When burning, please watch out for leaves and wind.

Fire Department Auxiliary

The Auxiliary supports the Fire Department with fundraisers (Chicken BBQ, Rummage Sale, etc.) and provides support and refreshments at large incident scenes. COMPLETE STREETS

<u>The Road Safety Task Force has been working to create a Complete Streets Policy the way many other towns in the Monadnock region have already done.</u> These towns include: Alstead, Antrim, Greenville, Harrisville, Hinsdale, Jaffrey, Keene, Marlborough, Peterborough, Swanzey, Troy, Walpole, and Winchester.

Complete Streets is the idea of trying to make our roads safer for everyone. It has nothing to do with specific changes at this point; it's simply saying that our roads need to be safer and that we need to consider this in whatever we do. The Master Plan (2018) already states that 'trails and outdoor recreation should be encouraged to maintain the Town's rural character. Safe roads are one of many ways to achieve this.'

Complete Streets is a way to make roads safer for everyone, whether you're walking, pushing a stroller, biking, riding or driving. It's a way to consider everyone when doing any road work, without changing what we love about Temple. Temple Community Hiking Group—2024

If you like to hike and would enjoy the fun of hiking with others, you may wish to get your name on the community hiking list maintained by Linda and Steve Bollinger. The hikes range in difficulty level, environment, and timing, and we try to adjust the features according to the preferences of whoever has expressed an interest in any given hike. Our group includes people of all ages-- some are regulars, some are occasional participants, and some just enjoy reading the hike descriptions.

Usually we meet at the bottom of our driveway, 230 Colburn Road, and then drive to the trailhead in caravan style. Directions to the appropriate trailhead are provided in the hike notice, if possible, so that hikers can find the trailhead on their own if they prefer. We take breaks for snacks and water or whenever someone requests a time to pause for whatever

reason. Hiking together is a wonderful way to enjoy nature, get some great exercise, and connect with others.

We have information on specific local, regional, and NH hikes as well as information on hiking resources in NH. These files are available for anyone's use and can be sent via email attachment. They will be updated later this year.

Hike information notices are sent via email on Wednesday or Thursday before the weekend for the intended hike. The notice includes detailed information about the upcoming hike, a summary of weather predictions, and a brief recap of the previous community hike. If you wish to be placed on our hiking participant notification list, please send your contact information to Linda (via our land-line home phone at 603-878-1078, leaving a message, OR, preferably, via email at likbollinger@gmail.com).

Our main community hike each week will still occur on the weekend, Saturday if possible, Sunday as backup. But, we have begun to offer weekday hike potentials as well. If interested, contact Linda for more information. We would love to see some of you on the trails.
